

**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF BALLOT MEASURE 7B INCREASING THE TERM
LIMIT OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY FROM TWO TERMS TO THREE TERMS**

WHEREAS, the 17th Judicial District for the State of Colorado includes Adams County and the City and County of Broomfield; and,

WHEREAS, the 17th Judicial District is served by one District Attorney, who is voted in by the people of Adams County and the City and County of Broomfield; and,

WHEREAS, the District Attorney is currently term-limited to two consecutive terms; and,

WHEREAS, other elected offices in Adams County, including the Commissioners, Clerk & Recorder, Assessor, Treasurer, and Sheriff are term-limited to three consecutive terms; and,

WHEREAS, State law permits the residents who live in the judicial district to modify the term limit of the District Attorney; and,

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of both Adams County and the City and County of Broomfield have referred to the November 5, 2024 General Election a ballot question that, if approved, would increase the terms limits for the District Attorney for the 17th Judicial District to three consecutive terms from the current two consecutive terms, should that individual be re-elected.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County, Colorado supports the passage of Ballot Measure 7B increasing the term limits of the District Attorney to be consistent with other elected offices in Adams County.
